Howard K. Weber, of North Huntingdon, died Monday November 8, 2021. He was a son of the late William and Katherine (Domiano) Weber and was also preceded in death by his brothers William, Kerry, and Frederick W. Weber. Howard retired as Principal of Woodland Hills High School and was a former Wrestling coach at Greensburg and Churchill High Schools.. He was also a Marine veteran and retired from the Marine Corps as a Master Gunny Sergeant. He was Commandant of both the Mon Valley Leathernecks and Marine Corps League. Howard was a founding member of Rescue 8 Ambulance, North Huntingdon and served as a Norwin School Board director for over 29 years. He is survived by his wife Lynne (Kemp) Weber; his children Terri (Jim) Cumbie and William (Amy) Weber; his grandchildren Jackie, Marilyn, and Howard Weber; siblings Wilfred (Fern) Weber, King (the late Ruth) Weber, Mary Kay Weber, Jeffrey (Carole) Weber, and Kim Weber (Kevin Kennedy); sisters-in-law Bonnie Weber and Haddie Weber; also numerous nieces and nephews.
