Barbara Joyce “Barb” Dubosky, 86, of North Huntingdon, died December 29, 2022 at home. She was born April 7, 1936 in North Huntingdon, daughter of the late John Dubosky Jr. and Barbara Ann Thomas. Following graduation from Business Training College in Pittsburgh, Barb worked as a medical assistant and financial manager for the surgical group Maxwell, Maxwell, and Dull. In addition to this position Barb assisted her parents with their own small business Dubosky’s Greenhouse. Several years later Barb was offered the position of business manager for Immaculate Conception Church and Cemetery, Irwin. She continued in this position for 36 years until her retirement January 1, 2021. Barb was a member of Immaculate Conception Church, where she served as a Eucharistic Minister, member of the financial council, pastoral council, stewardship committee, cemetery committee, social, and fundraising committees. In her early years, as a sports person, Barb was member of several duckpin bowling teams and leagues carrying an average of 175. The teams competed throughout the Northeastern states and Canada. Barb was one of the first women bowlers to appear on the Pittsburgh Bowling for Dollars T.V. show. Barb is survived by her brother John “Jack” (Karen) Dubosky of Harrison City, several nieces, nephews, and great nieces and nephews.
