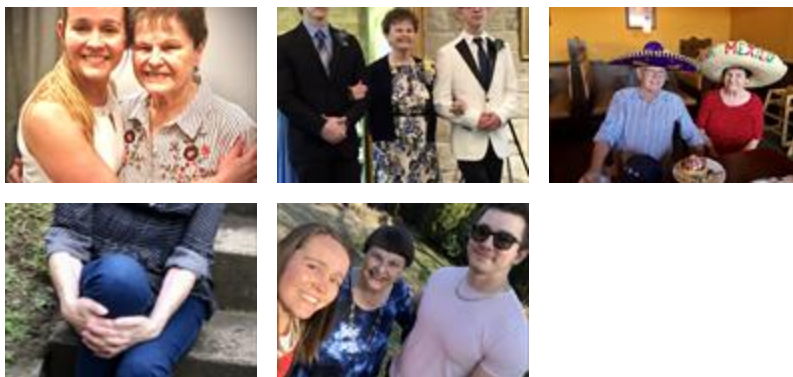
Sad are the hearts that love you
