Charles C. McWilliams Sr., 86, died on Thursday August 27, 2015. He was born July 4, 1929 in Tionesta, a son of the late Frank E. and Gertrude H. (Wert) McWilliams. Charles was an Army veteran that had a long career as a steel worker and retired from Washington Steel.
