“ In 1968 late one afternoon, Mrs. Peterman, our neighbor became an angel in disguise to me. I was only seven years old had cut my arm open very badly thru our basement door playing too rough as I usually did with my brother. My mother yelled for help as my dad was at work and she didn't know where to turn to. I was crying and said, "Put a band aid on it Mom!" Mrs. Peterman answered her cry and being the good nurse she was, offered neighborly help. She could have simply called for an ambulance but instead, wrapped my arm up in her best white towels and drove my mother and me to a nearby doctor at the top of Jacktown Hill. He took one look at it and said, "Take her to the hospital." She bundled me up again in the towels and off we drove to Westmoreland Hospital in Greensburg where I received more than 50 stitches in my right arm. Her quick thinking and calmness saved the day. Thank you, Mrs. Peterman, for being there for me when I needed you most. I will never forget you or the kindness you displayed to me that day.
