Francis Theodore "Ted" Kondrad, 76, of Irwin, died Tuesday, Nov. 19, 2013. He was born Dec. 31, 1936, in Detroit, Mich., a son of the late Frank and Pauline Kondrad. Ted retired as principal of Hempfield Area High School and began his teaching career at the Manor School where he coached basketball and football. He was a graduate of the University of Pittsburgh where he played on the basketball team and received his doctorate in education from West Virginia University. He was a talented musician playing in a band, enjoyed oil painting and was an avid deer hunter. Ted is survived by his wife of nearly 53 years, Jane (Parker) Kondrad; children, Lisa (Mark) Lowry, of Ponte Vedra, Fla., Michele (Mike) Santicola, of Moon Township, and Debbie (Paul) Gustafson, of Cheswick; and grandchildren, Samuel, Jacob, Abigail and Madeline Lowry, Sarah and Michael Santicola and Noah and Sophia Gustafson.
