Ruth P. Jordon, of Braddock Hills, died Friday January 13, 2017, at home. Ruth was an English teacher for East Allegheny School District from 1968 to 1999. She had served as president of the East Allegheny Education Association and was a member of PSEA and the NEA. Ruth was a member of St. Maurice Catholic Church, Forest Hills. She attended St. Joseph's Grade School, Braddock, and graduated from Sacred Heart Catholic High School in Shadyside. She received her Bachelor's and Master's degree and completed the required course work toward her Doctorate from the University of Pittsburgh. During her tenure as a teacher, she sponsored the student council and served as a class sponsor. She was a busy teacher that reviewed essays for college applications including resumes, coached students for speaking at graduation ceremonies, and mentored many new teachers and student teachers. She enjoyed traveling and had visited Scotland, Ireland, England, Italy, Wales, Russia, Germany, and Holland. She was born January 11, 1946 in Pittsburgh, a daughter of the late Henry Matthew and Margaret (Quinn) Jordon and was also preceded in death by her brother Henry James Jordon. She was a granddaughter of the late Congressman and Mrs. James Leland Quinn. She is survived by her sister Clara A. Lengyel of NY, NY; her close cherished friend Sandra Kresovich; nieces and nephew Mary M. (Anthony) Corallo, Rachel (Kendel) Joyce, Dr. Clara Lengyel Kremenic, Nicholas Henry Lengyel, and Katie Jordon; great nieces Madeline Light, Ava Light, Emma Light, Claudia Zanzig, Cameron Eckley, and Elizabeth Corallo; also cousins

“Ruth Jordon was one of those teachers whose great passion for their discipline easily translated into expanding the minds of their students in the classroom. She was a truly great teacher. Her classes challenged me and I must've learned something because I passed the AP English test and earned credit for college, a goal which I never would have considered had she not encouraged me to do so. Encourage maybe isn't the right word, though, because she made it a point to talk to me about my future and college while I was content to go be a laborer in the mill. So, aside from class, she became a mentor - teaching me about what I needed to do to get to college, talking plainly with me about wasting my talent. (She was, after all, the only teacher, perhaps the only person ever, who believed my writing was "a talent.") She wrote letters of recommendation for me to Carnegie Mellon, Pennsylvania State University, and Seton Hill College, as did Mr. Baker and Mrs. Hoffman, the guidance counselor. I went to the interviews at each school, and of course I couldn't afford CMU. I chose Seton Hill and I think Ms. Jordon was pleased with that, but her contribution didn't end there. In cahoots with Ruth Hoffman, she connected me with a grant program that assisted with all the fees and books for my first year. That's phenomenal, if you ask me, that a teacher would go out of their way like that but that's who she was. She cared, and, while I'm sure there are many other lives that she touched, the difference she made in mine was a shift from one world to another: it changed my life for the better. I'll always be grateful for her influence on my life and I'm so sorry I didn't get the chance to reconnect with her to let her know that. Because of her inspiration and guidance, I have a bachelor's degree in Journalism and a master's degree in Management.

One of the fondest memories I have of her was at Christmastime, December 1981. She had decorated her classroom door with a Christmas tree and pasted onto it a number of decorations: a snowflake, a bow, probably a stapler. I don't recall that it won the contest, but I do recall her singing "Lovely to Look At" (in the manner of Irene Dunne) while showfully displaying the work of art

like Vanna White displays letters and cars and such on "Wheel of Fortune." Her humor always flawlessly delivered the full meaning of "guffaw."

May God be with you in your sorrow even as He holds her in His arms...
