The Reverend George Michael Hanko went to rest with his Heavenly Father on November 4, 2014. He was born in Westmoreland City to parents John Hanko Sr. and Anna (Martincheck) Hanko on February 23, 1937. He was a graduate of Thiel College, Class of 1960, and the Lutheran Theological Seminary of Philadelphia in 1963. His ministry was 44 years of ministry at St. Mark Lutheran Church of Duquesne where he held both Slovak and English services. He also served as Secretary of the Duquesne Ministerium. In addition to his parents he is preceded in death by sisters Nancy Marto and Carol Rigney. Remaining loved ones include his wife of over 49 years Nancy (Kovac) Hanko; his daughter Deborah Lee Hanko of Ohio; siblings John W. Hanko, Ronald Hanko and Robert Hanko, all of Westmoreland City, Patricia Richert of Harrison City, and beloved brother David James (Kristan) Hanko of Penn Township; also many nieces and nephews.
