



## William G. Lunn

October 3, 1922 - October 18, 2014

William G. Lunn, age 92, of Irwin, passed away peacefully Saturday October 18, 2014, in Walnut Ridge Memory Care, Greensburg, after a long battle with severe Sundowners dementia and Parkinson's disease. He was born October 3, 1922 in Adamsburg, a son of the late Franklin Boocks and Irene Abbott Lunn and was also preceded in death by brothers, Lt. Cameron Stahl Lunn, John Cameron Lunn, Maurice Johnston "Pete" Lunn, and Franklin Boocks "Man" Lunn; a sister, Harriet Virginia Lunn Smith; and infant great granddaughter Emilee Elizabeth Kiser-Loughran. Bill was a graduate of Norwin High School, Class of 1940. After high school he was employed by Westinghouse Electric Corporation before

enlisting in the U.S. Navy to serve our country. As a WW II veteran he achieved the rank of Pharmacist Mate, Second Class. Bill was sent to Africa, then to Salerno Italy, to train for the invasion of southern France and transported to the Pacific area serving on a PT boat, Platoon B-4, Battalion No. 8, until the end of the war and was discharged December 22, 1945. Upon returning from serving his country he attended Robert Morris College majoring in Accounting. He then began his career in insurance working with his father in law H. Earl Whitehead at their home in Irwin. (Nationwide Insurance at that time was known as Farm Bureau Insurance). Bill worked for Nationwide Mutual Insurance Company as an agent in Irwin for fifty three years. Over that time he acquired many designations; CLU (Chartered Life Underwriter), CPCU (Chartered Property & Casualty Underwriter, and RHU (Registered Health Underwriter). Bill was a lifetime member of Brush Creek Salem United Church of Christ, Irwin. Over the years he was extremely active serving as Superintendent of Sunday School and an Adult Sunday School teacher along with serving on numerous committees both in the Sunday School and church. His passion was sports. He loved the Steelers, Pirates, and was an avid Pitt fan. Bill loved to read, mainly history books about World War II as well as others about our country. For many years Bill was extremely competitive playing racquet ball, and hand ball. He enjoyed golf and played tennis into his late 70's. He also enjoyed walking and the outdoors. He was a member of the Carl Leroy McKelvey Post #472, American Legion, Manor, for over 55 years, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Post #33 of Greensburg, and a charter member of the National World War II Museum, in New Orleans, LA. Bill was also a charter member of Norwin Rotary serving as President, Treasurer, and on various committees. He was a member of the Westmoreland Business Referral Association, Westmoreland Investment Club, and the Norwin Area Chamber of Commerce. Until recently he also enjoyed a Friday lunch group with area businessmen and a Friday happy hour with a group of friends. At Bill's request there will be no viewing. Friends will be received from 1 to 3 p.m. Wednesday in the fellowship room of the Brush Creek Salem United Church

of Christ, 113 Altar Lane, Irwin, PA 15642. A memorial service will be held at 3 p.m. in the church sanctuary with his pastor Rev. Diane Wiley, officiating. Interment with Naval honors will be at the National Cemetery of the Alleghenies, 1158 Morgan Rd., Bridgeville, PA 15017.
